

Sexual Misconduct

Sadly, the last couple of months have brought almost daily reports of people who have been accused of sexual indiscretions. And, it seems that many of the accusations are true and have been admitted. While we may harbor a certain glee in seeing people in high places brought low, such a response to sinful activity is not a sign of love (1 Corinthians 13:6)

While we will agree that sexual misconduct is despicable, we must confess that we could easily be guilty of such behavior. We were created by God as sexual beings and sexual urges are part of who we are. Complicating our need to face up to these things is the fact that sexual activity is good when it exists within the God ordained boundaries of marriage. But our urges and desires don't want to stay within God's boundaries. The fact that we are surrounded by sexual imagery and internet fantasy does not help matters.

The Bible records some incidents of sexual sin. Amnon and Tamar may come to your mind. Potiphar's wife and Joseph also fall into this category and I find Joseph's response very helpful (Genesis 39). In this case, the aggressor, and identified harasser, is female which may not be the statistical norm. However, Joseph must have felt all the pressure. Joseph's response to her seduction is a model. "How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" He ran. And, he paid the price for his godly desire. In the end, whether we pursue sinful activity or not will revolve around the question of whether we want what God wants or we don't.

Having said that, it is a battle to want what God wants because sinful temptations are so powerful. Sexual temptations offer instant pleasure and who does not love pleasure? In the end, we must fight the battle daily and like Joseph run away from the opportunities that sin places in our path.

One of the best things we can do is be aware of our vulnerabilities and, like Joseph, run and don't look back. And we can pray that God will fill our hearts and minds with the knowledge of the pleasures that come with doing what He desires.

AN IMPORTANT CHANGE IN THE OFFICE OF DEACON HERE AT GRACE!

Several years ago, our denomination undertook an investigation into the question of women serving as deacons in the Church. To that point, it had been the position of the BFC that the office of deacon was one to which only men were appointed by God. But after considerable study of God's word and prayerful discussion in committees, Churches, and our Annual Conference, the denomination could find no real reason to continue holding that position. They found no instance where God's Word prohibits women from using their gifts in this role or declared it to be reserved solely for men. And in fact, it seemed God had called certain women to the position in the history of the Church. So a change was made to our Faith and Order.

The elders here at Grace, being concerned not to impose extra-Biblical restrictions on the movement of God's Spirit or deny any member of the Church the opportunity to use their gifts in ways God might be calling and equipping them, undertook their own study on the matter. Similar to the denomination, after a few years of study, prayer, and conversation, we found ourselves in full agreement with the BFC and felt a change was in order for us as a local Church. The decision was made to open up the office of deacon to both men and women.

Our desire at this point is to fill you in on how that decision was made, both on the denominational level and also here at Grace. So we've set aside the first two Sundays in February, during the Bible Class hour, to look at God's word together, look at the path forward for us in this area, and discuss any questions or concerns you might have.

We're excited to see how Christ will work in our Church and denomination as we seek to be more faithful to Him and His kingdom mission in this area. And we encourage you to come be part of the conversation as we start the process forward.

Special Sunday Classes on Women Deacons For All Adults and Teens

FEBRUARY 4th – Ralph Ritter, pastor of our Wissinoming Church and member of the study committee appointed by the denomination to consider the Bible's stance on women deacons, will present some history and perspective on how their committee and eventually the denomination arrived at their conclusions.

FEBRUARY 11th – Scott Simmons, chairman of our board of elders, will share how God led us at Grace to change and what that change will look like moving forward.

Congregational Meeting - February 11

We will have a brief congregational meeting immediate **after Worship on Sunday February 11.** We will meet in the Sanctuary for the purpose of officially receiving the 2017 Financial Report (available in the lobby) and to elect the Church's Delegate and Alternate Delegate to BFC Conference. We will have our normal fellowship time in the gym after the meeting, followed by a special class for Adults and Teens on Women Deacons.

Missions Giving

You perhaps wonder, what happens to the funds designated for the Missions Outreach of our church?

Each year the Missions Committee gathers information from the individual missionaries and the local and foreign ministry organizations we support. We ask about their accomplishments, goals, future plans and financial needs. A budget is then developed by the committee and ultimately presented to the Elders for approval. For 2018 the Missions Budget is \$128,000. Not included in that is the Missions Conference Goal, which usually is about \$15,000. Last October more than \$16,600 was received. Giving for Short-Term teams and individuals last year was more than \$45,000. The recent Special Offering for the Philippines Disaster Relief was over \$7,000.

In addition we gave \$1,000 to Wissinoming BFC in Philadelphia as a way to encourage them in their outreach to a depressed area of the City. Also, \$1,000 was given to help Jeff and Emmy Ort, in Montana, purchase a new van to accommodate the special needs of their foster son Orion. Chris and Becky Merrick were sent to Morocco on a Special Assignment and needed \$3,000. We provided 1/3 of that. Trevor and Ashley Morse resigned from University Campus ministry with Inter-Varsity so that Trevor could enroll at Gordon Conwell Seminary to prepare for long-term ministry. We were able to send a gift of \$1,150 toward his tuition costs.

If you ever ask, "does my giving make a difference"? The answer is YES! As a result of your GIFTS, your PRAY-ERS, and your PARTICIPATION the Gospel is being heralded near and far.
