

# Emily Bronkema Dancing for Christ In Honduras and Mexico

Emily is going on a Missions trip with Christian Ballet Co. to Honduras and Mexico March 12 to March 26 with her college.

They will be spreading the gospel through dance in Honduras and Mexico. "Deliver Us" is the story of Israel out of Egypt and ends with a crucifixion scene. After the performance they go into the audience to meet with people and talk with them. They will also be staying with host families where they can share about Christ.

Emily will have many opportunities to use her Spanish. She took Spanish in High School and went to Costa Rico. Although she only took one class in college, Emily has been reading the Bible in Spanish and watching Spanish movies and is working on memorizing the Roman Road in Spanish. A friend mentioned that God has a plan for her to minister in a Spanish speaking country. She has been praying about going to Honduras and now the opportunity to go has come.

#### **How We Can Pray:**

- \* Emily needs \$1300 by March 1 of which she has raised close to half
- \* Pray for trip safety. There is a lot of political unrest but the areas they are going to should be fine.
- \* Pray that the Lord will work through the language barriers. The music that they are dancing to is in Spanish.

#### Fake News

"The news media prints fake news as it suits their political views."
"Politicians are all liars." "The Russians cyber-hacked our election results." "The Russians had no involvement in our elections." So who do you believe? Can you believe anyone? How can you spot fake news? People lie. You know that is true. And, you know God forbids lying. You would be an unusual person if you never told a lie or used a half-truth but, if you are a follower of Jesus, lying is not characteristic of you. So you are sensitive to hearing how lies get tossed around.

What about the other side of the equation? "...Love believes all things..." (1 Corinthians 13:7) Do you believe what people tell you? Does this imply that you are to believe whatever anyone tells you? What if the person you are talking to has a history of lying to you? Does this teach that being naïve and gullible is a good thing?

The rapid fire, staccato statements of 1 Corinthians 13:7 show that "believes all things" is not a stand-alone statement. Bears, believes, hopes, and endures all things come in one breath. In this setting, the issue is relationships of love. Put these statements together and you hear that loving relationships are consistent, stable, and reliable. These relationships are the special relationships between husbands and wives, parents and children, brothers and sisters in Christ, and best friends. Those relationships don't exist without trust.

God is not telling you to believe everything you hear in the news or to forget that politicians often give only that part of the truth that supports their position. God is not calling you to believe obvious lies. But He is telling you that you must trust the people you really love.

Maybe you don't lie and don't listen to lies but do you trust the ones you love? They need to know it.
