



### On Advent or the Coming of Christmas

Disclaimer: I did not attend a school where the Grinch was headmaster. And, Ebenezer Scrooge is not in my genealogy. Both are fictional so any actual connection between me and them is fictional. By the way, Scrooge gets a bad rap. "...It was always said of him, that he knew how to keep Christmas well, if any man possessed the knowledge." I guess he was not so bad after all.

I noticed Christmas started at the beginning of October this year. The advent seems to get a tad earlier each year. I notice because it is a sore spot with me. I love what Christmas celebrates and many of the events that surround Christmas. But (and you knew there would be a but), the significance and joy of Christmas is being gutted by the desire of retail stores to sell things. Christmas is about buying things for people and you should get started early because there will be a rush and you can set aside Black Friday to stand in long lines for bargains or the following Monday which is dedicated to on-line purchases and be sure to take advantage of any sales.

My complaint is not that people buy gifts to be nice and I don't begrudge merchants who want to turn a profit. I have my own ideas about what is wonderful about the Christmas season. I enjoy seeing decorations, the special events, family gatherings and our holiday worship times. Yes, you will notice I did not mention gifts. I guess we have Magi to thank for that and if we must blame someone, let's blame them. But perhaps it should be noted that they did not stop at Walmart on the way to Bethlehem nor did they check on line for the latest bargains. They brought gifts to Jesus to worship Him. "And going into the house they saw the child with Mary His mother, and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered Him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11-12). That seems somehow far removed from standing in line on black Friday.

The first giving of gifts came as an act of worship. I am not suggesting that you not give any gifts if that brings joy to you and others. And, I am not suggesting that you limit the number of parties you attend or how many Christmas cookies you eat. I am suggesting that you focus on Christmas as a time to worship and appreciate what God did in sending Jesus to us.

We have to peel away the encrusted layers that now cover Christmas. Peel away the need to buy gifts for people who have everything. Peel away the stressed schedule. You may even need to peel away some of the Christian traditions. Peel enough and you will come to the incarnation and the celebration of Jesus, the Word who became flesh and dwelt among us.

In the words of that fictional immortal Tiny Tim, "God bless us, every one!" May the joys of Christmas be yours in abundance!
