Russia: June 14 to 25, 2019

Camp Promise in Montana: June 23 to July 6, 2019

Bible Camp for Special Needs Children and Adults. They need counselors to work one on one with those who are physically



and/or mentally challenged as well as cooks, maintenance and other camp helpers.

Handi-Camp Canada: July 27 to August 4, 2019

Bible Camp for Special Needs Children/Young Adults. They need counselors to work one on one with those who are physically and/or mentally challenged (may need to lift camper).

Important message to all adults who are currently working or would like to work with children/youth at Grace BFC in any capacity:

Thank you for your willingness to serve the children and youth at Grace BFC. This church has a long legacy of excellence in our children and youth ministries and we want to continue to walk out that calling from God. In order to protect both our children and our workers, we have revised several documents outlining procedures and policies regarding the care of minors. If you would like to continue working with children and youth in any capacity (not only consistent volunteers/teachers), you must complete the following 3 tasks before March 1, 2019.

- 1. Read the updated children's protection policy/ other related documents and watch a short video highlighting changes made and other important reminders.
- 2. Complete the mandated reporter training program online.
- 3. Sign a form stating that you have completed steps 1 & 2.

You will receive an email with more detailed instructions and pdfs of all files needed. There will also be paper copies available if that will be helpful. Lastly, if you are unable to access the videos/mandated reporter training on your own, there will be a training event at church after Sunday school on February 10th from 12:00 - 2:00.

Again, thank you for caring for our children so well. It is my desire to do everything in my power to safeguard you and our children from situations/incidents that would hinder or distract from the great work that God is doing within our church walls.

Thoughts on Winter

"You have fixed all the boundaries of the earth; You have made summer and winter." Psalm 74:17

Now that the new year has begun, we face the serious part of winter. Given a choice between the heat of July and the cold of January, I will take the cold. You can always put on another sweatshirt but there is a limit as to how many shirts you can remove. So, I am not sure I want to move closer to the Equator where winter has a more minor role. And, I recall hearing from some that being closer to the Equator means you only experience one season. So winter is here and that's how it is.

I don't want to sound like I am complaining. The psalmist writes that God made both the summer and the winter. Two very significant points come out of this fact. First, God created the seasons and the entire universe. Summer becomes fall which turns to winter which ends with spring which returns again to summer. That's how it works because that is how God made it. The warmth of summer and the cold of winter are God's design. While God does not change, He made seasons which do. But the change is patterned and predictable which enables us to have some idea of what is coming next.

This leads to the second thought. God not only created the seasons, He governs them. The seasons result from the order in our solar system and the rest of the universe. God not only made the world; He also governs the movements and moments that make up the world and so there is order. Winter follows summer because God makes it happen.

These sorts of observations are encouraging. The psalmist began this section of the psalm by wanting to make a point, "Yet God my King is from of old, working salvation in the midst of the earth." (Psalm 74:12) The fact that God's world is predictable is based on the fact that God is predictable. When He says He will do something, you can count on it, like winter and summer. He has promised to work salvation in the midst of the earth. Jesus came, died, rose again, and ascended and reigns. The good news is that sinners like you and me can count on Him. Salvation, like summer and winter, is assured because God is predictable.

So, put on another sweatshirt. Throw a log on the fire. And be prepared for snow. Yes, and know that God will still be gracious and merciful.
