God's Work in Liberia

Last month we sent Mark Kessler and PJ Hartzell to Liberia with Compassion Corps. Here are some of their reflections from the Trip. Additional photos at Grace in the hall outside the gym.

If I had to summarize the trip from my perspective it would go something like this. I went hoping to do three things. The first was to deepen personal relationships with Martha, Pastor John, Pastor Tage and Sam. The second was to come back with a good idea of the direction to take with the ministry there at Martha's, one that would truly benefit Martha and the kids long term and move them closer to being self-sustaining. The third was to understand the vision that Pastor Tage and his wife Ruth have for the medical clinic, the elementary school, the school for training nurse assistants and lab techs, and their plan for growing their church and serving/reaching their community for the kingdom. I feel like all 3 were accomplished and I returned more encouraged than I expected with where things are at Martha's and where they are going. - Mark Kessler









What an awesome opportunity to visit Liberia with Compassion Corps! The Lord put together the perfect team of 9 ladies who were medical people, children's workers, and teachers, plus Mark Kessler who was a wonderful encouragement to our partners in Liberia, a fact finder, and a facilitator to getting work projects started and hopefully completed soon.

We four nurses helped run medical clinics at Healthline Clinic for nearly 8 hours on Monday and Thursday, seeing over 170 people each day. We were overwhelmed to see about 700 people waiting in line on Thursday. We could not see all the people that day, but Pastor Tage made sure that they all heard a Gospel presentation while they were standing in line.

The rest of the week was filled with visits to Martha's Children's Village, Elwa Hospital to teach classes to single, pregnant teens, Marinda's Haweh Academy, and Lifeline Institute to teach classes to the nurses' aide and lab tech students.

Thank you to all who donated supplies, medicines and money for the medicines for Liberia. Thank you also for your prayers and words of encouragement along the way. I am so happy that I finally got to meet most of Compassion Corps' Liberian partners and could finally place actual people with the names I having been hearing for years. Mark and I look forward to sharing many stories about our Liberia trip with our church family in the near future!





"You meant it for evil..."

When I read the story of Joseph which gets lots of space in the book of Genesis, I do some deep thinking. If you have never read the whole story, you should. It is presented in Genesis 37 – 50. A summary would show you that Joseph is knocked down, is up again, knocked down and up again. This cycle is repeated. He is sold into slavery, imprisoned as a result of a false accusation of rape, promised release but forgotten. It is not hard for me to imagine myself becoming very hardened and bitter. So, how did Joseph escape the destructive trap of bitterness?

After Joseph's father Jacob died, his brothers who were responsible for his miserable circumstances, thought Joseph would finally let them have it and expected Joseph's retribution. Joseph's response was marvelous. "Do not fear," he said, "For am I in the place of God? As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good..." (Genesis 50:19-20)

How was Joseph able to give this answer? It mystifies me that Joseph should be so aware of the goodness of God after all the calamity he experienced. It would appear that Joseph somehow saw a bigger picture than the catastrophes he endured. In the midst of his struggles, he saw that God was doing something. Joseph does not get a lot of coverage in the New Testament but he is listed among those who believed. "By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones." (Hebrews 11:22)

It is this about Joseph that makes me think deeply. While I have never experienced what Joseph experienced, I do experience ups and downs. I enjoy and appreciate the ups. But the downs are another matter. I don't tend to see the bigger picture and see how God is working through them. I need to remember what is going to happen to my bones. When all is said and done, my bones (my resurrected ones) are going to wind up in the presence of God. The ups and downs are just what I will go through until I get there. That's the bigger picture I need to see.
